Our schedule is packed. There's no breathing room. We've got lights, action, drama and a whole lot of melodrama. We've also got our first films from Tibet and Myanmar. We're the Asian and World premiere for films from Brazil, Belgium-Singapore and Scotland, UK. And so many other precious little gems. And to celebrate the 13th edition of the festival, we've peppered the programming with bits of queer horror — everything from B-Grade Bollywood brilliance to much experimental excitement.

The boundaries of horror as a genre are leaky, liquid. A film that is quiet, slow and unassuming can be as horrifying as one that slashes at you and keeps you waiting for what's around the corner. Some of us love these films that take us into realms of the psychic, the violent, the deprayed, the degraded, the vulgar, the otherworldly. Horror makes something erupt onto a surface. It also allows for victims to claim

their vengeance in blood, fear and social retribution.

The teeth that sink into flesh, the hair rising on the back of the neck, the fear that pulsates in your nether regions, the being that occupies your body, the power to mutate into an unearthly other, the thirst that comes with a desire for vengeance, the feeling of dread at an unknown threat. Horror as a genre is already queer in its own erotic way.

At a time in which the genre is entering the big budget mainstream - with films and series like Kanchana, Arundhati, Stree, Ragini MMS, Pisaasu, Aranmanai, Tumbbad, Bulbul, and recently Adhura - we pay a tiny tribute to horror cinema in this - the 13th edition of the Bangalore Queer Film Festival.

Now: the real question – Which one of our many films will send a shiver down your spine?



Their search for a home parallels their ongoing search for a place in this society that continues to keep them away in a section that cannot be the centre. Laila is torn between being true to herself and preserving links with the family she was born into. Meanwhile, Roshni treads a fine line between concealing her identity and living the life that she wants, but it is not without its dangers.

As the search for a home continues, it transcends physical spaces and biological bonds. New friendships blossom and help comes from unexpected quarters.



A beautiful young girl, unfortunately possessed from her childhood by a vengeful spirit, wanders around lonely places to seduce and kill people, gradually becoming lost in a dark world of revenge and lust.



DIRECTORS: Shyam Ramsay & Tulsi Ramsay Shyam Ramsay (1952-2019) and Tulsi Ramsay (1944-2018) were film directors and editors, and two of the seven renowned Ramsay Brothers, sons of horror cinema pioneer Fatehchand U Ramsinghani, active in Hindi cinema throughout the 1970s and the 1980s. The two brothers

started directing their own films with *Do Gaz Zameen Ke Neeche* in 1972, and then there was no looking back.

Together they directed and produced a number of cult horror movies such as *Darwaza* (1978), *Ghungroo Ki Awaaz* (1981), *Purana Mandir* (1984), *Tahkhana* (1986), *Veerana* (1988) and *Mahakaal* (1994). Their films feature "zombies, vampires, werewolves, reanimated corpses and snowmen" (Outlook, 18 Sep 2019). They are also credited with making the country's first horror TV series, *The Zee Horror Show*.



Ana was born on an island. She is a middle child. The three siblings live with their mother and grandmother. As she grew up, Ana realised that girls and boys were given different tasks. Luís, Ana's best friend, loves dresses as much as pants. Ana admires him. Her friend Cloé arrives from Canada, bringing with her the glowing days of youth. With Cloé, Ana embarks on a journey that will take her beyond the horizon. The line between "Wolf" and "Dog" will reveal to Ana the right sea for her to sail.



DIRECTOR: Cláudia Varejão Cláudia Varejão was born in Porto and studied at the Creativity and Artistic Creation Program of Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation in partnership

with the German Film und Fernsehakademie Berlin and the São Paulo International Film Academy. She also studied Photography at AR.CO in Lisbon. Cláudia is the author of the short film trilogy Weekend, A Cold Day, and Morning Light. Ama-san, a portrait of Japanese divers, was her feature debut, receiving dozens of awards around the world, followed by In The Darkness of the Theater I Take Off My Shoes and Amor Fati. Besides her work as a filmmaker, she developed a career as a photographer, and she's a guest professor at AR.CO and Catholic University of Porto. Her work, whether in film or photography, documentary or fiction, lives from her proximity to those portrayed.





Lailaa Manju

Our characters Lailaa and Manju are two Mumbai-based girls in love, who fight to stay in love in the middle of the pandemic as Manju struggles to come out to her mother about her sexual identity and Mumbai shuts down due to COVID-19.



DIRECTOR: Kamya Nair is a writer, producer, actor and director. She has previously acted in *Uninvited* (2017), a short film; and written *Ruhaan* (2017). Kamya dreams of being a filmmaker with a chance of


making and being a part of important stories. She was industry initiated through a brief stint as an associate producer with Viacom18's OTT platform, Voot. This led her to work with boutique production houses like Lekh-haq Films, writing short films and acting. And occasionally, she even picked up gigs as a graphic designer, editor, photographer and artist.




Set in a retro atmosphere, *Riptide* is a story told in three chapters. Suku and Charlie are lovers living in a college hostel room, living a life drowned in love, literature and music, nearing the end of their college life. A life-threatening disease forces Suku to leave the hostel for treatment. In a near-death experience, Suku has a vision of Charlie screaming in pain. A healthy Suku comes back to the hostel only to find a traumatised Charlie reading a never-ending novel, blood stains on the wall and a never-ending love song which keeps playing repeatedly on the radio.



DIRECTOR: Afrad VK Afraid VK is an independent filmmaker from Kerala. *Riptide* is his debut film and started as a diploma film project.

Aalapanam is a film about shared bonds that might connect broken families. It is a film about acceptance and aspiration. It carefully weaves motifs into its narrative and shows how love persists even when everything else might not.


another short film, *Untitled Music Project*. Aalapanam is his graduate film where he explores his journey as a trans man.

Amar revolves around the protagonist Amar who is blind from birth and who has graduated from a blind school. Amar's mother passed away in his childhood and he now lives with his father in a small apartment. The film takes the audience along with Amar as he wanders — sometimes on populous streets and sometimes in solitude playing his harmonica. He has a new friend named Iqbal who is a filmmaker and lives in the same town. Amar rejoices in Iqbal's company and likes to be around him. Eventually he discovers that he and Iqbal are deeply emotionally connected and have feelings for each other.

Anshul Kumar is a student pursuing
his Masters in design with film
and video as his specialisation at
the National Institute of Design,
Ahmedabad. Amar is a fiction film he

directed as part of his student design project. Before joining NID, he worked in a film production house based in Mumbai and took up acting assignments in films, including full length features.

Bad Behaviour is a performative documentary that sets out to explore MG Road, Brigade Road and Church Street - the neighbourhoods that gave Bangalore its moniker 'the Pub City' in the 80s and 90s because of their watering holes and cruising spots.

Thomaskutty and Thomachen, two middle-aged gay men past their heydays, meet at Koshy's Parade Café. Emboldened by a few drinks, they set out to explore the streets of their heady youth for an evening of revelry – from Black Cadillac to Italian Guesthouse, from Knock Out to Roach Guesthouse, the boxing arenas, belly dancing, and all the debauchery of the good old Pub city. However, as they leave Koshy's, they find themselves in a neoliberal gentrified urban transformation!



DIRECTOR: Bhavana Rajendran, Rency Philip and Sharanya Ramprakash Bhavana Rajendran, Rency Philip and Sharanya Ramprakash are theatre makers based in Bangalore. None of them call

themselves filmmakers... yet. Of the motley lot Sharanya may have some understanding of films and dramaturgical narratives, while Bhavana and Rency come with their special expertise in performing nonsense, onstage and off. The two of them have also spent many years together on the streets of Bangalore pub hopping, jaywalking, and generally creating nuisance. However, let not Sharanya's capabilities disarm; she is an expert in unruly herself.

Since then, she has had the good fortune to be exposed to all kinds of cinema, through which she not only discovered her passion to be a professional writer but saw how cinema could break boundaries and societal constructs. The qualities of empathy, authenticity and allowing moments to breathe are what truly shone through.

DIRECTOR: Jung In-hyuk Born in 1997, he graduated from Korea Animation High School and studied film directing in college. His short films, in which he mixes the stories of non-mainstream characters with B-grade humour

and various filmmaking techniques to create a genre that defies definition, have earned him a passionate fan base. *Daddy in the Refrigerator* won the Bucheon Fantastic Special Award at the Mise-en-scène Short Film Festival in 2018 and advanced to the finals of the Seoul Independent Film Festival.

Morreu and Gênesis dos Novos Deuses. He directed Rodrigo de Roure's The Last Days of Gilda. His most significant work was Brecht Morreu (2003), a bilingual tribute to Bertolt Brecht, staged at Espaço Sesc in Copacabana with Brazilian and German actors. He collaborated as a scriptwriter in ten soap operas and three series at Record. There, he was the main author of the soap opera Genesis and the series Miracles of Jesus. He wrote and directed the webseries Minutinho de Terror (Best Stories Series Award at the 2018 Rio Webfest). He wrote and directed the short film A Lama da Mãe Morta, still unreleased.

In a conversation constructed through subtitles and supertitles, the film reveals the filmmaker's and his partner's process of understanding and making meaning of Diva's life as well as their own relation to it. Diva's life becomes a reflection about queer identity, distance, intimacy, and incoherent histories.



DIRECTOR: Nicolas Cilins Nicolas Cilins (*1985, France) is an artist living in Geneva, Switzerland, working across the disciplines of visual arts, filmmaking, and performance art. He has shown



With the onset of COVID-19 and the rise of Anti-Asian hate, he stopped associating with his assimilation name and took on the artist name Ayoto Ataraxia.






Pivoting between two stories of women and their relationships with objects—a Swedish woman's marriage to the Berlin Wall, and a suffragette's hatcheting of Velásquez's *The Toilet of Venus*—Mary Helena Clark's *Exhibition* is a maze-like tour through images and artefacts, a dense cryptography of the forms and objects that hold us in.

Mary Helena Clark is an artist
working in film, video, and
installation. Her work uses the
language of collage to explore
dissociative states through cinema,
bringing together disparate subjects

and styles that suggest an exterior logic or code. Using the conventions of narrative, language, and genre, her films explore shifting subjectivities and the limits of the embodied camera.

For two years starting in 2020, this work has been forming along the edges of disquiet and premonition, in fragments and intensities, through wandering and not-staying. It has tried to find language for, and ways across, the bizarre upheavals of social and political values with the rise of fascism here and a global pandemic. It has insisted on being amongst the things that keep from falling apart. Filmed in Delhi (and parts in Kolkata), these incomplete fictions are of the people, places and protests that keep the language of hatred at bay and absorb the city's grief and euphoria. In them are the continuous echoes of a violent and tenuous present. This video/essay composes a timeline of the city at an angle through the time of this work. There is a shadowy sense of a protagonist who un-dreams it all; a stranger, who it turns out, is no stranger at all.



Shot on the Thai tropical island Ko Yao Yai, Xin explores the economic and cultural challenges the island faces as it shifts from a predominantly farming community to one dependent on tourism. While the environmental instability underlining Warm Spell unfolds, Xin constructs a dreamlike backdrop for more personal explorations of the island and its influence on the body.



DIRECTOR: Shen Xin Shen Xin practises languages of returning, where one imagines, articulates and creates unhurt spaces of belonging through

songs and stories. Their engagement with moving image, video installation, performance, painting and collective processes are held in reciprocity of relations, and the depth of the polyphonic. Active commitments are placed in the learning and engaging with land-based patterns of thoughts and actions, while bearing witness to forms of governance. They received the BALTIC Artists' Award (2017) and held the Rijksakademie residency in Amsterdam (2018–19). Shen Xin practises on Miní Sóta Makhóčhe (Minnesota), the land of the Dakhóta Oyáte, as well as on Lënapehòkink (New York City), the land of the Lenape peoples.

Her short films have been internationally well received with over 200 festival participations and over 50 awards from festivals. Her creative work is rooted in exploring childhood memories, mental health and self-realisation, with a mission to amplify trans and queer storylines. Having grown up painfully confused about gender, love, abuse, and sex, Amina strives to navigate stories that unmask some of the most commonly messy human beliefs, emotions, and desires.

Transferred to film from tape, and beautifully lit, shot and edited, Between consists of a rapid sequence of moments of sexual activity. The recurring image is of a naked woman with a strapped-on dildo, which she caresses in mock masturbation. In her gyrations in front of the camera, the familiar image of the gogo dancer is utterly subverted and transformed by the presence of the false penis. In subsequent scenes she caresses, fucks and buggers a variety of partners whose gender is never firmly established. At one point we think we see a man, his penis just visible in shadow at the extreme edge of frame, and yet . . . She lives and works as a freelancer in Berlin. Her films have been shown at the Internationales Forum des jungen Films, Berlinale; the short film festival in Osnabrück, European Media Art Festival in Osnabrück; and in London, Tokyo, Paris and Vienna. They are also part of collections owned by the Goethe-Institut, ICA-programme London and the Filmmakers-Coop London.



Mondial 2010 is a discussion of institutional borders in modern-day Middle East. It uses video as an apparatus to transgress boundaries that are inflicted on people in spite of them. It is a travel film in a trajectory that doesn't allow travel, starring two male lovers, in a setting where homosexuality is a punishable felony. Shot with a hand-held camcorder, Mondial 2010 borrows the aesthetics of a travel video log. It normalizes the abnormal, and by doing so creates its own universe of possibility. It is a shift from the mainstream passive view of the Palestinian/ Israeli conflict that places the victim/oppressor in the forefront of the produced imagery. This video glides over this conflict with an upper hand.



DIRECTOR: Roy Dib is an artist and an art critic. He co-founded the theatre group Zoukak (2006-2009). He has presented works at venues and events such as Video Works

(Beirut), Palais de Tokyo (Paris), Home Workspace Program, Ashkal Alwan (Beirut), and Videobrasil (Sao Paulo). He currently writes for the cultural section of Al-Akhbar newspaper, in Beirut.

Untitled Sequence of Gaps

Germany 2020

Composed of vignettes in different techniques and materialities, *Untitled Sequence of Gaps* uses the form of an essay film to approach trauma-related memory loss via reflections on light outside the visible spectrum – on what is felt but never seen. Shifting between planetary macro scales, physical phenomena, and individual accounts of affective subject formation, the film considers violence and its workings, class and queerness not through representation but from within.

The montage is slow and rhythmic, yet uneven. The flow of images is interrupted by gaps no less significant than the imagery itself. Footage in which public memory stands in for personal remembrance stands along sequences recorded via infrared imaging, under ultraviolet light or microwave radiation. While pondering the effects of the invisible and the power inherent in shifting violence beyond visibility, the piece reflects digital archives and technologies that help shape the relation to past, present and future. Ghosts appear from holes ripped into time by an unremembered childhood, and a witch-burning ritual in the artist's rural hometown serves as a foil against which to question the politics of visibility.



DIRECTOR: Vika Kirchenbauer Vika Kirchenbauer, born in 1983, is an artist, writer, and music producer based in Berlin. In her work she explores opacity in relation to representing the "othered" and

discusses the role of emotions in contemporary art, labor, and politics. She has given lectures at various universities and art schools. Her award-winning works have been shown at art institutions and film festivals worldwide.
